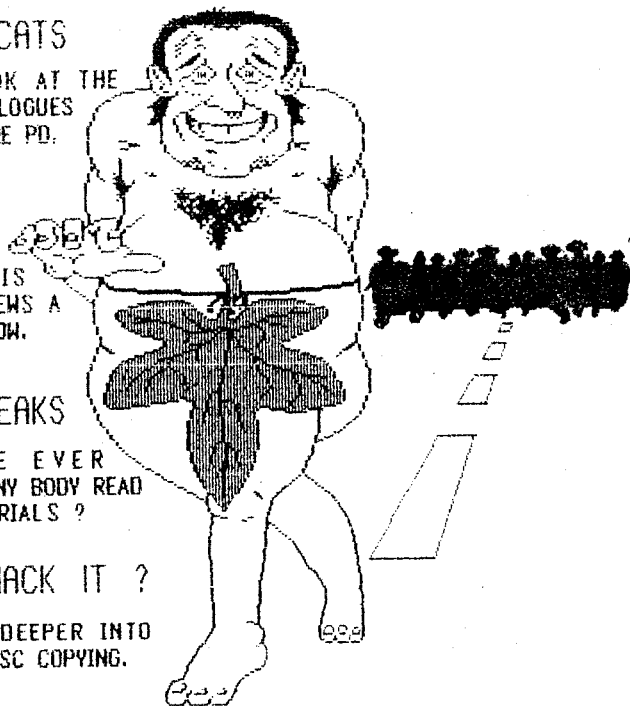

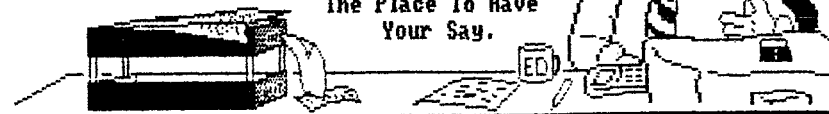

Best In The West

In this mini series we'll be having a look at CPC South West's PD software, and finding out which of their SERIOUS software comes out on top. This issue JR will be putting hard catalogue software under the microscope to see which does the job best.

After reading Arthur's letter last issue concerning printing out labels I thought I'd do a one off article on the subject. Now you now me I'm a cheap skate, I mentioned the idea to 'Dear Dave' telling him that I'd send a few discs in a couple days (when I'd saved up enough cash) but by the end of the week he sent me a disc full of software, he's a nice man, a very nice man.

Before we dive head first into this subject we'd better have a little chat about the paper, obviously you can go out and spend loads of dosh on proper blank labels which are about a penny each last time I looked. A cheaper way is to use address labels, these are roughly the right size for a 3" disc. Alternatively you can use ordinary A4 paper and cut out each label to size, using a glue stick to secure them to the disc.

Pay back time... Below you will find a chart indicating which software does what, obviously at a glance you can see DIR PRINT is the best of the litter, but why is it ?

CONDENSED PRINT OUT

To have half a chance of fitting all the information onto a label this option is a must.

LARGE PRINT OUT

If there are too many files to fit onto the labels you may want to consider producing a one off label for the disc, a hard copy will remind you what is on it.

K FREE / DATE

These little bits of information can be useful if you compile your own discs.

TITLE

A must if you like to keep your discs in order, Art 1,2 & 3 etc. Or the title of the game.

BITH CONTINUED

PROTECTED / HIDDEN

If the sectors have been change all you'll get is a message like 'RUN DISC', which is absolutely useless if you want a label. So again you'll need to know the disc contents to produce a one off label. Use Parados/Nirvana.

LARGE FORMAT

If a large format disc is full of software you'll never fit all the information onto the disc, yet again it's time to make a one off.

FORMAT

You'll need to know what type of software you already have on the disc, no point trying to save a Data file onto a Vendor format disc.

ALTER THE PROGRAM

You can customize PD programs to suit your needs but you must never pass on any altered programs to your friends, where possible send a copy to the author, who may take on your suggestions and give you credit

if he/she updates the program in the future.

There are one or two points you may wish to change with hard cats, the location of some data may be better positioned, looking through the listing you will find the LOCATE command, alter the x,y positions to suit your own requirements.

If a disc has loads of files try doing a single extension catalogue, this is done by changing the CAT command to a DIR command,

DIR,"*.BAS"

Or what ever extension you require (change .BAS to CUT, or what ever).



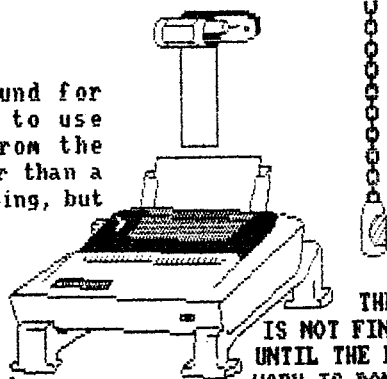

The easiest way I have found for these 'quickie' labels is to use address labels straight from the roll, they are slightly bigger than a 3" disc side so require trimming, but at 99p for 250 what the heck.

For convenience I store my address labels on a toilet roll holder, this is fixed to the wall about 18" above the printer. No hunting through drawers for me, no sir.

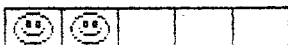

AA SNAKE - CPCSW PD

Remember the Amstrad Action type-ins and ACU's 10 lingers ? Dave used to write in quite regular with his listings, he must of made a small fortune in those days.

AAsnake is based on the super-sonic cycle race featured in the TRON film, the general idea is to wizz around the screen while trying not to hit any solid objects. The hard bit is the further you go the longer the trail gets (in this case the snakes tail).

Where AAsnake differs from the original concept is its harder, you aren't up against an opponent, instead you are racing against time. Also you have to collect tokens along the way, which aint easy considering how fast you are moving.

This version is better than most I've come across because the graphics are first rate, it's fast (we're talking quick reflexes here) and you've got more to do than just avoiding the walls.

Some may find it a tad too fast, but I feel if it was slowed down it would loose its 'just one more go' appeal.

LABEL DESIGN - CPCSM PD

A. Scully & S. Bartlett

Here's another PD program which knocks the socks off its commercial equivalent, like Super Labeler it allows you to produce 3", 3.5" and address labels complete with clip art.

The only thing LD can not do is print out in colour, but there is a driver somewhere in the public domain written by Dave Lawson and John Fairlie which will put that right. So for 50p you can do everything Super Labeler does, but better. YES, you get better results with the PD version.

Label Design works under WYSIWYG, so you will get an exact copy of what you see on the screen, rather than just guess work (you get very little indication

what the commercial one will produce). Supplied with the designer is

a quantity of clip art and fonts, both of which can be topped up with others straight from your friendly PD librarian, so there is quite a lot of variety.

Most users will only require a single copy of each label but there is an option to print out up to 255 labels, this will come in handy for PD librarians who may wish to print out vast quantities for the likes of you and me.

You start off by selecting the

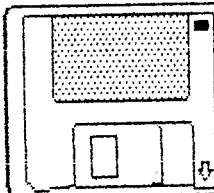
size label, then all the commands are on that screen, so there is no popping in and out of different menu's all the time, much easier and quicker. Best of all there is an outline drawn around the label, which you can switch off if you intend to print onto the expensive blank sticky back labels (about a penny each, that's ten quid for a 1000, I'll stick to ordinary A4 paper, 9 labels for a penny). The outline comes in handy as it gives you a guide where to cut.

Downers

The main problem with LD is placing the text just right within the template, it works under cursor position rather than pixel.

Another problem is

disc space, when saving a label the program saves the whole screen rather than treating it as a piece of clip art, meaning each time you save a label you loose 17k of disc space. Finally, while you are waiting for the main program to load you are bombarded with 'green issues' like saving the whale. Now I'm all into saving the environment but surely this is not the place to force feed the nation with such propaganda.

You are faced with nine squares with either a blue or a pink picture on, the idea is to turn over the tiles using the F1 - F9 keys and SPACE so you end up with nine pink squares. The graphics are very well drawn MODE 1 jobbies, these range from a simple cross to neat 3" discs, full marks to Eliot for his art work. When you press the F keys a rectangle appears around a section of the rid, this will tell you if you will rotate 3,4 or all nine squares. When you completed one level you move onto another, the graphics and starting positions alters and you have to put your thinking cap back on. Unfortunately, after a few goes you'll spot the sequence to complete it, when you find this the game becomes rather dull.

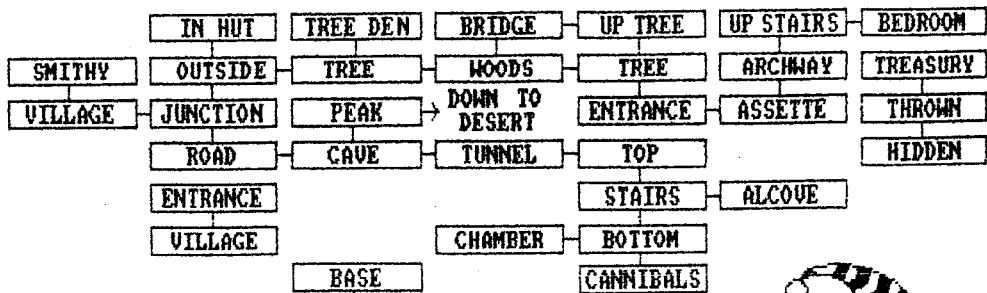

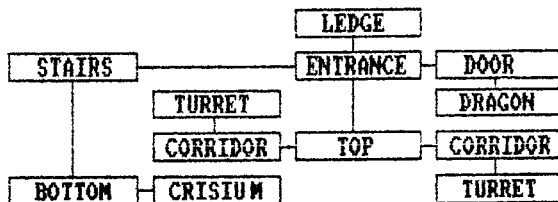

REVIEWS

Pro-Ext is a utility that slots neatly in the gap between a word-processor and a Desk Top Publisher.



HEADLINES

Pro-Ext is run together with Protex. Thus enabling clip-art and headline text to be printed within protex files. The standard fonts from your printer may be used for the body of text, The fonts from Pro-Ext used for the Headlines.

Titles, Large print or Headlines may be printed out using any combination of the eight fonts, provided or by your own designed font. The size of the Headline text can be Quadruple, Double or Normal the height or width in either Draft or NLQ print.

At this stage it must be noted that Pro-Ext requires 128 K, an Epson compatible printer and Protex on Disc or Rom.

HOW IS IT DONE

Run "Pro-Ext then type I P to load Protex as normal, the printer redirection is then installed. Using the Protex EDII mode, the Pro-Ext command's are keyed in, from the following
(Ctrl x)A(parameter)(Ctrl x)A(command).

Pro-Ext comes complete with eight fonts, an excellent font editor, a graphics convertor, a bar and pie chart drawing module and a couple of clip art demo.

EXAMPLE

GRAPHICS.

Only clip art with the .CUT extension can be printed. There is plenty of PD clip art available as this is used in POWERPAGE-STOP PRESS. (Dave has plenty in the PD Library).

ctrl x A script.fnt ctrl x A C will print a centred Headline using the script font.

In addition, Multiface Screens and Advance Art Studio .WIN extension files may be converted using the Graphics conversion module.

Using this format any Headline Text or Clip art are set up together with the normal Protex fonts and entered in the text.

CHARTS

Simple Bar and Pie charts may be generated using the charting module and saved as clip art and printed out with Protex.

Using the Print command in Protex, the Pro-ext disc will be accessed on the control codes and the fonts or clip art loaded to memory during the printing process.

CONCLUSION- This is one of many print enhancing utilities that are available for the CPC, It does take a little getting used to at first, but I found by studying the demo's provided was the best way to understand the commands.

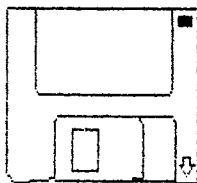

Unlike most other Print enhancers, this utility can Print CLIP ART within Protex, it has a superb Font Designer and most important, the results are GOOD.

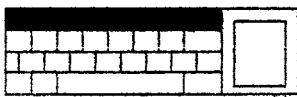

The CPC EMULATOR by " THE PUCA "

CPCEMU is a CPC Emulator for PC's. It was written by MARCO VEITH. It emulates the CPC464,664 and 6128, it is very easy to use and has many features. You can download it on the INTERNET and you can probably get it from some PD Libraries.

Many changes can be made to suit your needs. One fun thing to do is change the " Amstrad" on the familiar opening screen to "Schneider" or "Orion" among others. One excellent feature is it's own "black box" which does the same as a Multiface 2 or a Hackit.

Software can be transferred from your CPC with 3.5" disc's or you can download software on the internet. Some PD libraries which take 3.5" disc's could also supply the software.

Following Peters article. he also wrote to say that CPCEMU reads files in the following way...

1 . CPC disc's can be transferred to .DSK files. these files work in the same way as 3" CPC disc's. (.DSK) files are created using a PC program called Transfer.

2 . Ordinary files (.BAS , .BIN)etc, can be saved onto the hard drive or floppy disc's, this is done by typing I TAPE:SAVE"filename",you select the area of the hard drive or floppy disc to save to.

Recently I have been informed that a new version of CPCEMU will be out soon, (V1.4),my article is on version V 1.3b more information on this in the next issue.

MAXIDOS

(AN EARLY VERSION OF PARADOS)

In the last issue of CPCSM, there was a review on 'PROCOPY', on the same disc is a program called 'MAXIDOS'.

When you first run Maxidos, it gives the impression of a boring type of CP/M program, CP/M boring Peter ??? Dave)))... well yes it does look a little like CP/M because it shows the A > (A prompt) But in it's use, it will prove far from it.

Maxidos has it's own instruction manual, and you would be well advised to have a print out of it long before you start using the program, as it will save a lot of cursing later.

So what does it do, well for a start, How many disc handling utilities do you know that will handle 'ROMDOS' ????. there isn't many around, YES OK . I know DES ROM'S will, but, you have to have the 'ROMDOS' rom present in your rom-box, and Maxidos handled this way back in 1990. long before the GODSEND of PARADOS.

Maxidos has all the usual programs in it, just type in "HELP" at the A> and you will be given a list of commands, "A" or "B" drives can be accessed just like Parados, but a little slower. all depends on how fast you can type.

Maxidos does have the 'KILL' command, NEVER use this command unless you don't want to see the erased file again .

As Maxidos is now Public Domain Software, do get your self a copy and see for your self, NON parados owners who use NSWP or similar, will save a lot of time without having to boot up 1 CP/M

Now why did I mention Maxidos ?. Most Parados owners must of at some time copied a file using Parados and found that we got a file "FILE.eeeee", and the whole of Parados starts to copy a huge file until it say's 'DISC FULL', I have come across this more than once, so I had to resort to 'Booting' up CP/M to use NSWP to get the file across, for a large format disc. BUT our saviour is here, Just use Maxidos for your large format IE: D20, if you are using DATA or SYSTEM, NIRVANA or DISCOMAGIC will do it.

Now that Maxidos is P.D. Ian has put it on ROM for me together with Discomagic. So if I am experiencing any problems with a file transfer, I have other programs on Rom to use, well worth the pounds.

A final tip for you. Have you ever tried to copy a DATA file to a DATA format disc and end up with the message " Disc Full " on the destination disc ???, the answer is that someone used 'Discomagic' to copy load files in, by using Discomagic, you can get 187 K on a disc instead of the 170 K.

PROPRINT BY DAVE



What is PROPRINT ????????

Proprint comes on Disc or Rom, I have the main program on rom, with all the font's on disc (44) in total.

So how good is it ????????

I have tried a few print enhancer's in the past, but to my opinion, this beet's the lot, I know Brian wont agree with me, (see Brians review on PRO-EXT), I have tried Pro-Ext, but as yet not had any success with it, it's too fiddly to set up for my liking, where as the Proprint is simple to set up.

Both Pro-Ext and Proprint work with PROEXT, and with Proprint you can have up to 5 font's in memory at the same time, why anyone would want that many I just don't know, and apart from the normal Prottext control Codes IE: (control X .L) for large print, Proprint also gives you 5 further style of print codes, most of which is the same as the Prottext style codes.

So how does it work ???.

You load up your prottext as normal, type away, and when you want to print your letter here is what you do.

Press escape to put you back to the edit mode, now all you do is load Proprint like this.

Type in | proprint | (space) | 2
press return- depends how many
fonts you are loading.

. Type in | 8bit,3 (this is
because I have an 8 bit port, if
not you type | 7bit,1 press
return, and finally | font,1,block-
| press return.

A high light bar will appear on
the bottom of the screen, (your
printer should be switched on).
press COPY and your print out
will look quite posh, even with a
dot matrix printer.

If you want to use more than one
font, on the last line where you
load the fonts, here is what you
do.

| font,1,block-1 (this is the
main font being used)

| font,2,hitech-1 etc etc until
you have all the fonts you
require.

You can switch in and out of the
5 fonts very easy by the control
codes, just like when you want to
change from NLQ to ITALICS.

Do I recomend it YES, YES, YES.

ONLY one fault as far as I can
see, for some fonts you have to
set the left hand margin, and you
dont find that out until you
start to print out your text.

Music Tutorial

Part 6 Tricks & Tips

Following on from last issue we'll be taking a look at ways of making our music sound better. Tip 1 get Jean Michelle Jarre to write it, only joking! For each Trick there is an example tune. So as always you'll need the Tracer program (on the C.D. last issue). For those of you with SoundTrakker V1.1 there are SONG files of the same filename as the tracer files. So lets get started

'OCTAVE EFFECTS' :-

Using different octaves for the same melody. Pretty simple this one. One sound channel contains the melody. Another sound channel contains the same melody, but we change all the octaves of the notes, making them all 1 higher. This gives more depth to the sound. There is plenty of room for experiment here. Have a listen to example file "MTPGE1"

Changing the octave of each note in the melody. The actual notes of the melody stay the same. But all the octave numbers are altered either up or down. Usually to some logical pattern or rhythm. A bit more tricky to do, but much easier than writing the melody like this to start with. Listen to example file "MTPGE2" if you try any effects like this, do keep a copy of the pattern in-case it doesn't turn out o.k.

Alternating octaves for a stereo effect this is very similar to the first octave effect, except that you can only hear the difference if you have your CPC rigged to external speakerstap. Say we have the same melody on two sound channels again. Starting on the any channel we make the octave 1 higher, for the next pattern position we make the other channels note 1 octave higher. And so on, alternating between the two channels. It really does sound good on a stereo. The example file is "MTPGE3"

'MIXING CHANNELS' for various effects :-

All channels will mix fine in the internal speaker. But please note when you play any mixed channels only A&B or B&C will mix properly on external speakers. Externally channels A and C are totally separate from each other, therefore will not mix.

Using 2 channels. If the same melody is played on channels A&B at the same time, a fuller sounding note will be heard. Also the note will be louder as the volume of both channels is combined. Listen to "MTPGE4" which starts with only 1 channel playing so you can hear the change.

Using 2 channels for a phasing effect. If a melody is played on channels A&B, channel A with a normal instrument. But channel B with an instrument with all its tone envelope positions +1. A phase shifting type effect is produced. This is because channel B's instrument has a slightly lower pitch. However if the pitch is adjusted too high or too low you will be able to hear the difference. And it will sound out of tune. You will probably have heard this type of effect before. Have a listen to example "MTP6E5"

'MIXING INSTRUMENTS & CHANNELS':-

If a single melody is played on channels A&B, but the instrument on channel B has a different volume envelope design. The sound produced is much clearer, makes more impact. You should be able to see the different volume envelopes on the tracer program. You could also alternate the 2 different instruments used, like with octave alternating only changing the instruments. Take a listen to "MTP6E6"

'INTERVIEWING MUSIC':-

Percussion & Bassline or Harmony. For this effect the bassline is interviewed onto the same channel as the drum sounds. First put the drum rhythm onto the pattern you want. Then the remaining unused pattern positions are used for the bassline. The harmony could be interviewed instead of the bassline. Whichever though, this is a useful tip, as with only 3 channels we need to maximize use of space. There are many possible variations to this tip,

are just two of them so listen to "MTP6E7" and "MTP6E8"

'STEREO EFFECTS':- for the majority of these you'll need an external Amplifier

Speaker Jumping. Play a melody across all 3 sound channels. The first note on channel A, second on B, third on C, fourth back to B then start again with channel A. This creates a very pleasant sound with an echo. Try it "MTP6E9"

Stereo Movement. Sountrakker is equipped with a Volume command. Allowing the volume to be lowered to almost silence, or raised to maximum volume. With a little patience, sounds can be faded up & down. From 1 speaker to another. Even made to move past from left to right. The example for this effect is someone running up a gravel path. Then past from left to right. And lastly running away again. With these kind of effects it is well worth persevering to get the volume levels just right. The example file is "MTP6E10"

Stereo Echo's. This effect uses 2 sound channels, both playing the same melody. Only the melody on channel C is played slightly after that of channel A. This creates an Echo. To hear it load up "MTP6E11"

When a tune is played through the internal speaker, it doesn't really matter which channels different part of a tune are played. But, when played on an external amplifier it becomes important to choose carefully LEFT, CENTRE or RIGHT. Which are channels A, B and C respectively. With only 3 channels its important that the best combination is chosen for your music. So carefully listen. If say the melody is on the LEFT, Harmony CENTRE and Drum rhythm on the RIGHT. When the music is played you may find the concentration of sound towards the right hand side. This could leave the LEFT speaker with the melody almost out on a limb of its own, and can really detract from the overall impact of the music! So its worth persevering here also to get the music on a whole, to sound balanced across the sound channels.

Its also important to balance the instrument volumes. You may find initially that instruments sound fine on their own. But when played together, they may overpower each other. Even drown out an important part of the melody. So you may want to lower the volume of a particular instrument. Just because the PSG only has 15 volume levels, does not mean the volume levels can be fairly well fine tuned. Every little thought like this, helps polish the music off.

The NEXT tutorial is the last, so we'll be looking at what to do with your music, once you've written it. Any questions in the mean time, I'd be happy to help. My number is on the HELP Page. 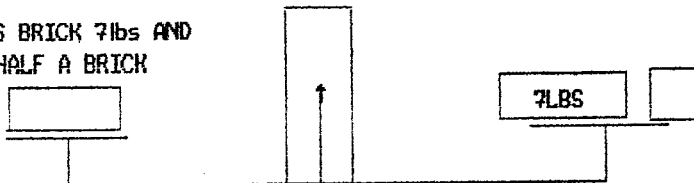

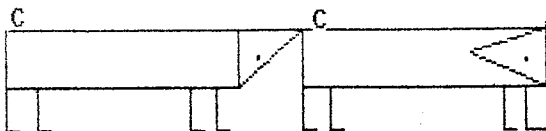

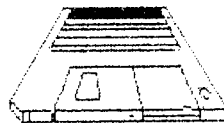
